## AzHHA's 2007 Community Benefits Overview\*

It is generally understood that hospitals offer what may be called *essential medical services*. Emergency medicine, medical/surgical services and a diverse array of specialty programs form the core of these essential medical services at hospitals throughout Arizona. Less widely understood, however, is that hospitals sponsor free medical, education and support services that benefit individuals and improve the overall health of hospitals' respective communities. They also provide charity care to the poor and underserved.

*There to Care: Building A Healthy Arizona* is designed to quantify and demonstrate hospitals' community contributions that go beyond traditional healthcare services. The community benefits initiative will highlight, for example, programs that feed the hungry of North Phoenix...provide prenatal care to the uninsured of Tucson...and deliver medical and dental services to uninsured and underinsured children in Prescott.

Community benefits, as illustrated above, are programs and services that address identified community health-related needs, regardless of source or availability of payment, and provide measured improvement in health access, health status and the use of healthcare resources.

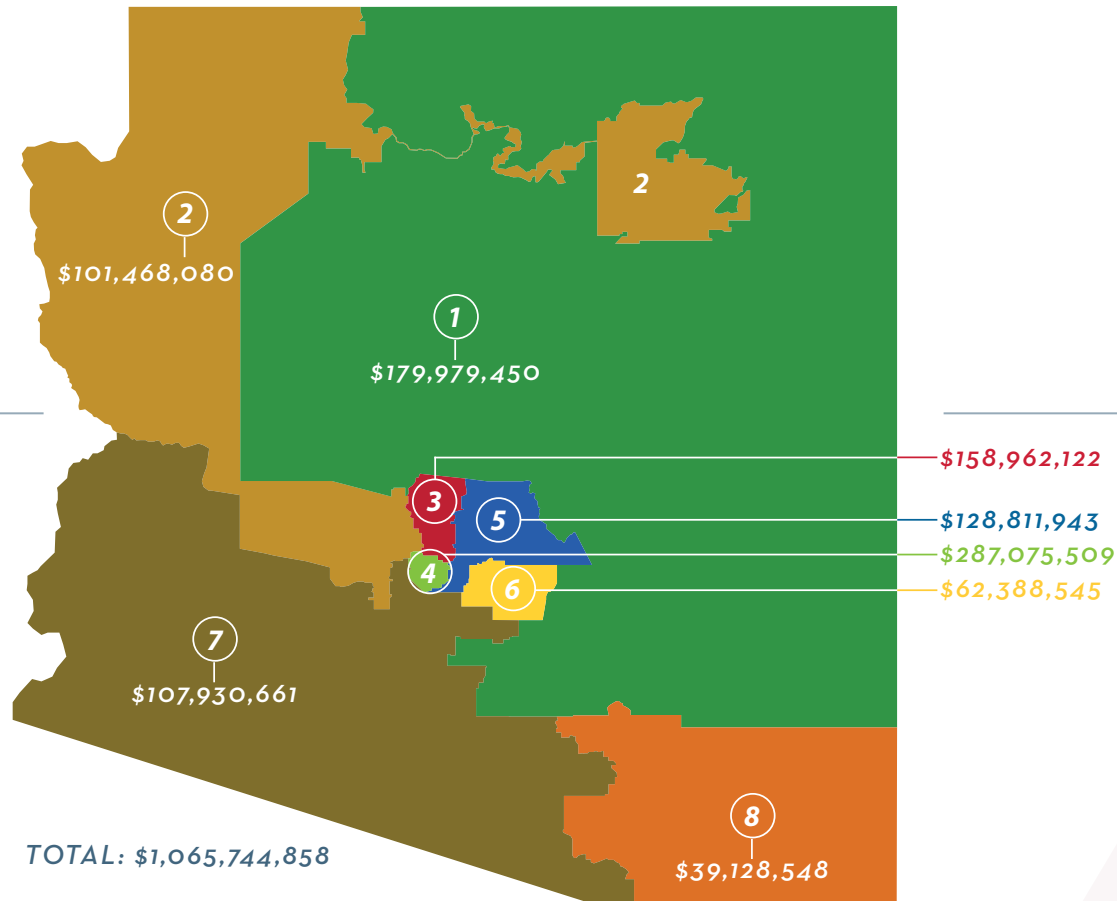
In addition, the programs and services considered community benefits meet one or more of the following criteria:

- ▶ support the organization's community-based mission;
- ▶ target the problems of the poor or medically underserved;
- ▶ impact the health status of the identified community;
- ▶ reduce community health costs;
- ▶ are accessible to the entire target community regardless of ability to pay;
- ▶ would likely be discontinued if decisions were made on a purely financial basis; and
- ▶ stimulate external community partnerships.

*There to Care: Building A Healthy Arizona* represents a total of 86 percent of Arizona inpatient hospital beds. It includes community/acute care, behavioral health and rehabilitation hospitals.
